### **HEALTH**

#### **Cura-quick at HyVee and HyVee Drug Store**

Curaquick offers basic family health care services for common family illnesses by a licensed practitioner as a walk-in basis. You pay \$35. Additional fees may be collected at the time of service if minor lab work is conducted. Insurance is not accepted. Services are for patients 18 months and older.

#### **Hawk-I**

Healthy and Well Kids in Iowa provides health insurance for qualifying children ages 0 to 19. Hawk-I pays for doctor and dentist visits, hospital stays, well child visits, and eye exams. Monthly fees are determined by your household income, but will not exceed \$30 per month.

Offers you the opportunity to have a family provider to help you and your family maintain your health and care when you are ill. A sliding fee is available to patients if they qualify and are willing to provide financial documentation. Services are only provided on an appointment basis.

Provides social services such as: ADFC/FIP, food stamps, emergency funds, medical insurance, childcare assistance, etc. to qualifying families, individuals, and children.

Also provides services to individuals and families of individuals with special needs including respite care and community living assistance.

DHS – Child Protective Services 822 Douglas St 255-0833 / (800) 362-2178 –

Anyone that believes a child has been abused or neglected may make a report. DHS tries to only intervene when necessary. A Child Protective Investigator will conduct the inquiry. Some of the things considered are the age of the child, if the child is in imminent danger, and the nature of the injury or incident. If needed, DHS may provide protective services. If services are provided for the family, a treatment worker will regularly review the family's progress. In some cases Juvenile Court will be involved in a CPS case. CPS services end when the child is believed to be safe. Certain professionals (teachers, physicians, child care providers) are required by Iowa law to keep information confidential.
